Used motor oil in clear containers w/ lid

Oil filters

Rechargeable Batteries only

Styrofoam

Plastic bags – clean and dry

### CLEAN-UP DAY BRING:

Normal recycle materials

Appliances with and without freon

Scrap metal

Untreated wood

Tires –4 per household, no commercial

\*\*NO ELECTRONICS

A number of free electronic recycling events are held at various locations in the county throughout the year. Check the township website for day/time/location as the dates are announced.

**HAZARDOUS WASTE:** Can be taken to the Western Washtenaw Service Center (555 N. Zeeb Road). Hazardous waste is accepted Saturdays from 9 a.m. - 12 p.m. during the summer months. With questions and for winter hours, call 222-3950. There is no charge for this service, but donations are encouraged.  
**PAINT:** Latex paint and varnish can be dried out, or absorbed, by adding cat litter. You can then dispose in your normal trash collection. Oil based paint and varnish must be taken to a hazardous waste collection site.
